To the 26 members of the Palatines as they leave on their trip to the Palatinate and adjacent lands on the 31st of July. Divided into two flights - from Chicago and New York - the 26 travelers will meet in Luxembourg on August 1 with their tour guide, Dr. Delbert Gratz, Bluffton College, Bluffton, Ohio. In Luxembourg the group will pick up their motorbus and start their tour south through Alsace, Burgundy, cross to Basel, Switzerland. From there the group will continue north on the east side of the Rhine. Stopovers will be made at various places and side trips taken to small towns and villages. On August 21 the members will once again be in Luxembourg to board their plane for home. A few will remain to take other side trips before returning home.

Ohio Chapter members met with the new Ohio Chapter president, Mrs. Martha Agler, and discussed future plans for the Chapter. The tour group met with Dr. Delbert Gratz, the tour director. The new national constitution was adopted and new members were voted for the National Council during the business session closing the meeting. The proposed charge is \$1.50 per query containing up to 40 words, each abbreviation and date considered one word. Additional words over the 40word limit would be .10 ¢ each word. Queries would have to be received 20 days before publication, i.e., September 10 for the October issue; December 10 for the January issue; March 10 for the April issue: June 10 for the July issue. NEW REPRINTS

BOOKS FOR ANCESTOR HUNTERS

Several books have been published this year which should be valuable for researching. We also found one that was published in 1976 that has received little notice.

"Ohio Genealogical Guide", "Ohio COUNTY Genealogical Guides", and "Ohio Genealogical Periodical Index", a county guide. These three are published by Carol Willsey Flavell, C.G., 1978, 4649 Yarmouth Lane, Youngstown, Ohio 44512.

"County by County in Ohio Genealogy" has been revised this year by the genealogy staff of the State Library of Ohio, Columbus, Ohio. For information write the Genealogy Section of the State Library of Ohio at Columbus.

"Underfoot, An Everyday Guide to Exploring the American Past" by David Weitzman, published by Charles Scribner's Sons, New York. Highly recommended as a method source.
