## OHIO CHAPTER SPRING CONFERENCE SATURDAY, APRIL 23 1994

Our spring Conference and annual business meeting will be held at the Heimat Haus, 4553 Jackson Pike south of Columbus, Ohio.

Two Speakers have been selected for the conference. Mary L. Bowman of Athens, Ohio will present two of the sessions.

**Published Ohio Government Documents: A Hidden Resource.** This session will include information on how to use published Ohio government documents, the nature of their contents and significance for genealogical researchers, and how to locate information within the many legislative actions and journals, executive reports, departmental, office and commission reports, and those materials which, for want of a better term, are labeled miscellaneous.

**Ohio in the War of 1812.** An introduction to the the history of the War of 1812 in Ohio and the documents generated by Ohio's participation

The focus will be on the records generated during that time period, their contents, how they can be used by genealogists, and how to access them.

**Mary Bowman** is President and Fellow of the Ohio Genealogy Society and is a director of the Federation of Genealogical societies. She has been a Genealogy Instructor for Ohio University's Continuing Education/Workshops for 14 years and has conducted numerous genealogy classes, workshops and seminars nationwide. Her genealogical publications include 20 monographs and numerous articles on a variety of topics. she is presently compiling Abstracts of the Laws and Resolutions of Ohio which will be published by OGS in 1994. Her volunteer work has included serving as a genealogist for Ohio University's Alden Library where she has acquired the knowledge and skills to use a large number of reference tools and source materials. Her educational credits include a B.A. in History and Anthropology and a M.A. in International Affairs (History, Anthropology and Geography).

**Patricia M. Van Skaik** will present two sessions, one on **Immigration Research** and the other on **Census Research**. these sessions will focus on the early period.

She has Bachelor and Master degrees in History from the University of Cincinnati, and Master of Science in Library Science from the University of Kentucky.

Ms. Van Skaik is an active member of the Greater Cincinnati Library Consortium's History and Archives Interest Group and the Hamilton County Genealogical Society. She has taught "Beginning Genealogy" for Northern Kentucky University. Her areas of specialization are local history, immigration and census research, and African-American History.

The Annual Business meeting will be held during this conference.

## GUIDELINES FOR MAKING A LIBRARY REQUEST FOR LIMITED RESEARCH!!!!

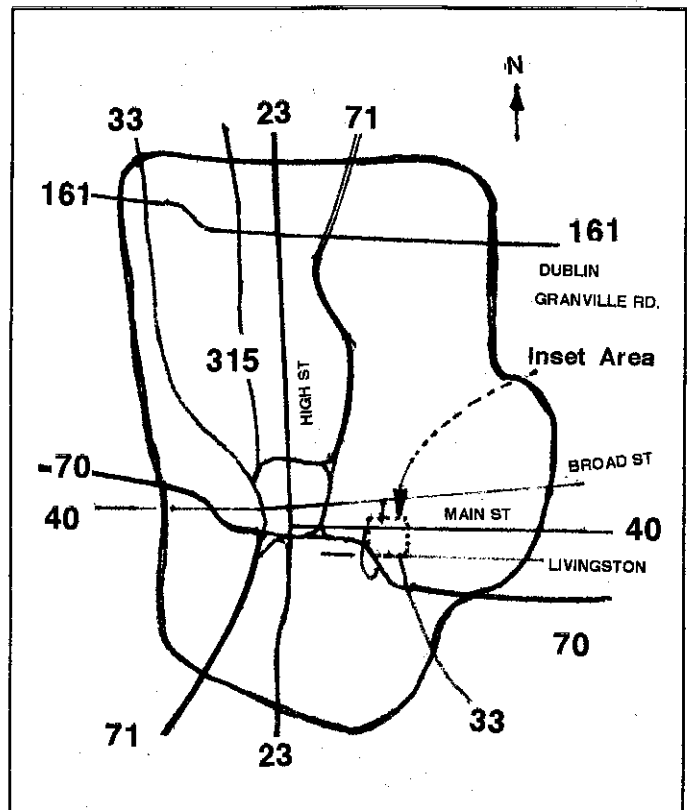
It would be helpful if each member would submit one surname per request.

If possible, include a specific event: birth, marriage, death, area etc. This information will narrow the search time involved.

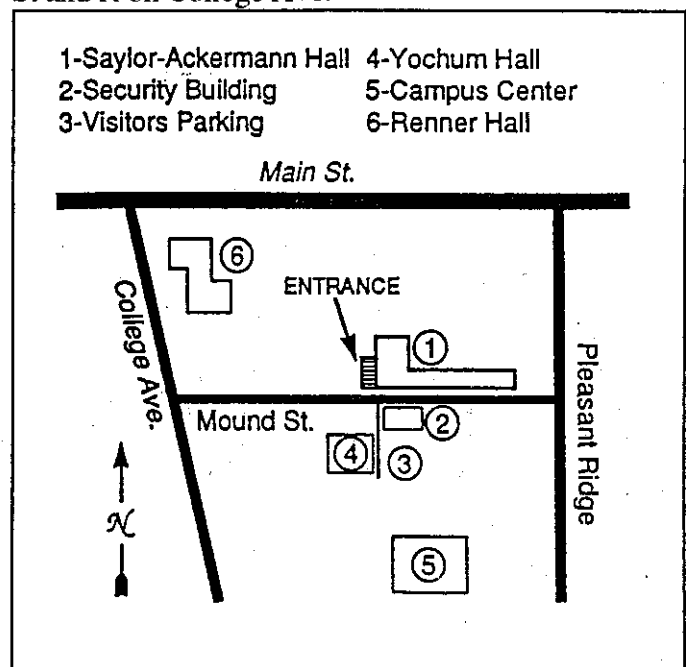

## CAN'T FIND THAT MARRIAGE RECORD?

Since Pennsylvania did not require marriage licences until 1885, West Alexander, a village near the West Virginia border, became a mecca for eloping couples from Ohio, West Virginia, and other states.

The records of two justices of the peace have been published: The Marriage Records of Squires Isaac and Joseph F. Mayes, Compiled by Helen L. Harris, C.G., Elizabeth J. Wall, & Betty T. Patrick. Bethel, Pennsylvania; privately printed, 1978.

Period covered: 1811-1844, 1862-1887. A copy is in the State Library of Ohio, 65 S. Front St., Columbus. *Submitted by Dr. Arta F. Johnson*

## Computer program aids Archives/Library Visitors

Researchers using the Ohio Historical Society's Archives/Library who have questions about the location or existence of records sometimes are kept waiting while busy staff members are helping other patrons.

Now these researchers easily can find things on their own, thanks to the Cardinal Archives/Library Information System, a new interactive computer program located in the library's lobby in the Ohio Historical Center.

Unveiled last November, the Cardinal offers information in eighteen areas, including marriage records, military records, photographic collections, and general information on genealogy. Patrons can find descriptions of the time span and content of the records as well as their location within the Archives/Library. The Cardinal also suggests additional sources of information and where to find them.

Other information available includes examples of indexes and completed call slips, and floor plans of the Archives/Library with locations of various records highlighted.

Little Sandusky, January 18, 1870

Dear Father and Mother,

*As an opportunity presented, I thought I would write you a few lines to inform you that we are about as well as could be expected. I hope this may find you all well too.*

*I must tell you about a traveler who made his appearance here last Sunday morning. None of us had ever seen him before, but he claims that he is somewhat related to us. We still can't get enough information from him because he uses a language that none of us can understand. I think we will keep him. Probably we will learn to understand him better in a few years, when we learn the nature of him better. I think I will someday make a clerk of him.*

*We have been having very changeable weather here. Sunday, it commenced raining. We had several very heavy showers during the night. On Monday, the streams were all over their banks. It has swept away the fences and corn from the bottoms along the rivers. It has done considerable damage in this neighborhood. I think it will hurt business some, consequently. Business has been very dull since the holidays.*

*Well, how have you been? Are you all well again? How is Willy? Is he well again? I hope he is well. I must come to a close. With our best wishes to you all, I remain your dutiful son-in-law.*

### Who was that Strange Traveler?

Old family letters give us a valuable insight into the lives and character of our ancestors. Sometimes they provide genealogical data and sometimes they provide the family historian with a puzzle to solve. The letter above provided me with both.

I was most curious as to who that "traveler" was who made an appearance at my gr. gr. uncles' home. If he claimed to be related to Henry why couldn't Henry understand his language? The relative would have spoken German or English and Henry could

understand those languages.

A phone call to a cousin clarified the matter. The letter was the announcement of the birth of Henry and Rosena's son, Albert Joseph Simons, born 16 January 1870. My files showed only the year. This letter provided the date. January 18 fell on a Tuesday in 1870 so "last Sunday" must have been the 16th.

It's a joy to know that our ancestors had a sense of humor. Look for humor in their letters, you might be surprised.

### Editor's Ramblings...

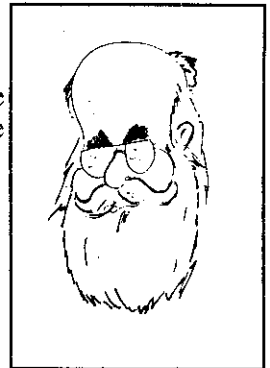
The January Ohio Chapter Genealogical Workshop was held at the Grandview Library on Saturday the 19th. It was very well attended and the room was filled. The second session was on the use of computer bulletin boards and was presented by Ms. Carol Montrose who started a genealogical bulletin board several years ago.
