You may want to do some research in the unique holdings of this campus's well-known library, so here's an **extra bonus**. Normally, the Mennonite Historical Library on the 1st floor of Musselman Library is closed on Friday evenings. **But**, to accommodate those of us who want to research on Friday, Librarian Delbert GRATZ has agreed to hold that area open until 10 p.m.. He is a most knowledgeable historian and author of Mennonite material. Many will recall occasions when he has been a featured speaker at our conferences.

BLUFFTON is located just off an I-75 Exit, and is easily accessible via many major or pleasant rural routes--take your choice. Check the **yellow** "insert" for directions, a local map for the college and Bluffton, and for overnight rooms and nearby motels--plus the Saturday *schedule*.

### BLUFFTON COLLEGE

Since 1889 Bluffton College, a church-related college, has been offering young people an academically sound liberal arts education. Today the College serves more than 660 students who come from all over the United States and the world. There are 30 major areas of study, including a two-year nursing degree completion program, computer science and Spanish/economics majors. Students may have a self-designed major. It has been commended by the NCA on its mission as a liberal arts college and its educational, physical, social, and religious activities fostering a total learning experience for students.\*

"The enlarged Bluffton College is the result of the vision of several educational leaders from different Mennonite groups for a united establishment of a standard college and theological seminary for all the Mennonite groups.

Bluffton, a village (of 3,310 inhabitants--Rand McNally 1980) is in the northeastern corner of Allen County. It was surveyed in 1837 under the original name of Shannon, but in 1872 the name was changed to Bluffton. Located seven miles northwest is a solid Mennonite Swiss community of some 2,000 members of 4 congregations--all of Swiss extraction. Some of the early names were: NEUENSCHWANDER, BUCHER, SUTER, MOSER, AMSTUTZT, JOHN, CHRIST, BOESIGER, LUGINBUHL, STEINER; then: ALTHAUS, BURKHOLDER, BIXEL, BASINGER, DILLER, GERBER, GRATZ, GEIGER, HILTY, HOFSTETTLER, LUGUBILL, LEHMAN, LOCHER, SCHUMAKER, SCHNECK, SOMMER, WELTY, ZUERCHER, etc.--. Another group of about 400 Mennonites, in the region of Elida in southwestern Allen Co., stem largely from Virginia and Fairfield Co., Ohio--." (more under various subjects in *The Mennonite Encyclopedia*).

## **"THE MENNONITE ENCYCLOPEDIA"- 4 VOLUME SET**

This is a massive 4-volume collection of 10,000 articles, 3,800 pages, 100 maps, 2,000 biographies, community history, pertinent surnames and family histories, with many tracing back into the 1500's and prior. It covers Mennonite people and events in Switzerland, France, Germany, and the Netherlands, along with America and other parts of the world. Originally published in 1955, printed in English, each volume covers part of the alphabet (A-C; D-H; I-N; O-Z) and costs \$45, but the set of 4 costs \$160. [Check Fall Conf. **bookselling area**; it may be worth acquiring for data on locations, history, and ancestors--PTM,ed.]

## **UNGARBLING MISPELLED GERMAN NAMES**

German names (surnames, given names, place-names) have often been misspelled, as English-speaking officials wrote down what they thought they heard. It is often necessary to establish the original German spelling to backtrack an ancestor in this country, and certainly to find him in Europe. Go by **sound**, not spelling, to determine German spelling. Four major ways sound affects spelling are:

- 1) German sounds **hard to differentiate**: B&P, D&T, G&K, V&F  
At the end of a word or syllable, B is sounded like P; D like T  
V is sounded like the English F.
- 2) Sounds spelled differently in **German** versus English: German W is sounded like English V; J like English Y. English sounds for w ("wuh") or j (as in just or George) don't exist. Some vowels: In German, IE is sounded like English long E, and E or EH like English long A, while EI is like English long I.
- 3) German sounds **not spelled in English**: harsh guttural sound CH may appear as H, K, or CK, or, sometimes to Y (as in Frölich to Fraley. English has no vowels with the "umlaut" above the vowel, as in ä, ö, ü, signifying an added e sound. Suspect an original umlaut if a name has variant vowels.
- 4) English spellings **not found in German**: Some diphthongs (EA OA, OU, and others); GH in Baughman from Bachman. German has no silent e at the end of a word or name.

## **CONFIRMING A PLACE OF ORIGIN**

While there is a lack of any "national index" to German records, there are centralized depositories of records at various levels (national, "state", regional, & municipal), invariably **filed by locality**, with no general index to them. Therefore, one needs to know **where** ancestors came from in Germany to learn where they originated. In the U.S.A. we have the same problem in knowing where to begin-- which state, county, tax, and other records??-- but we are often helped by the decennial census, especially when a name index has been compiled. Germany has no equivalent of the U.S. census; smaller areas do have some census records, but there was none made on a national level before World War II.

The **key** to searching German records is to try to narrow the geographical area; then check the holdings of archives at that level, looking for clues to serve as an index to the area (e.g. tax records). Local historical/genealogical societies who know the records well, may be able to offer ideas as to where a surrogate index exists for their area. **Acquire more knowledge and delve more deeply into this subject** with the monograph, "Confirming a Place of Origin"; purchase at Nov.6 Fall Conference, or \$4.80 ppd. from the author, Ken Smith, 523 S. 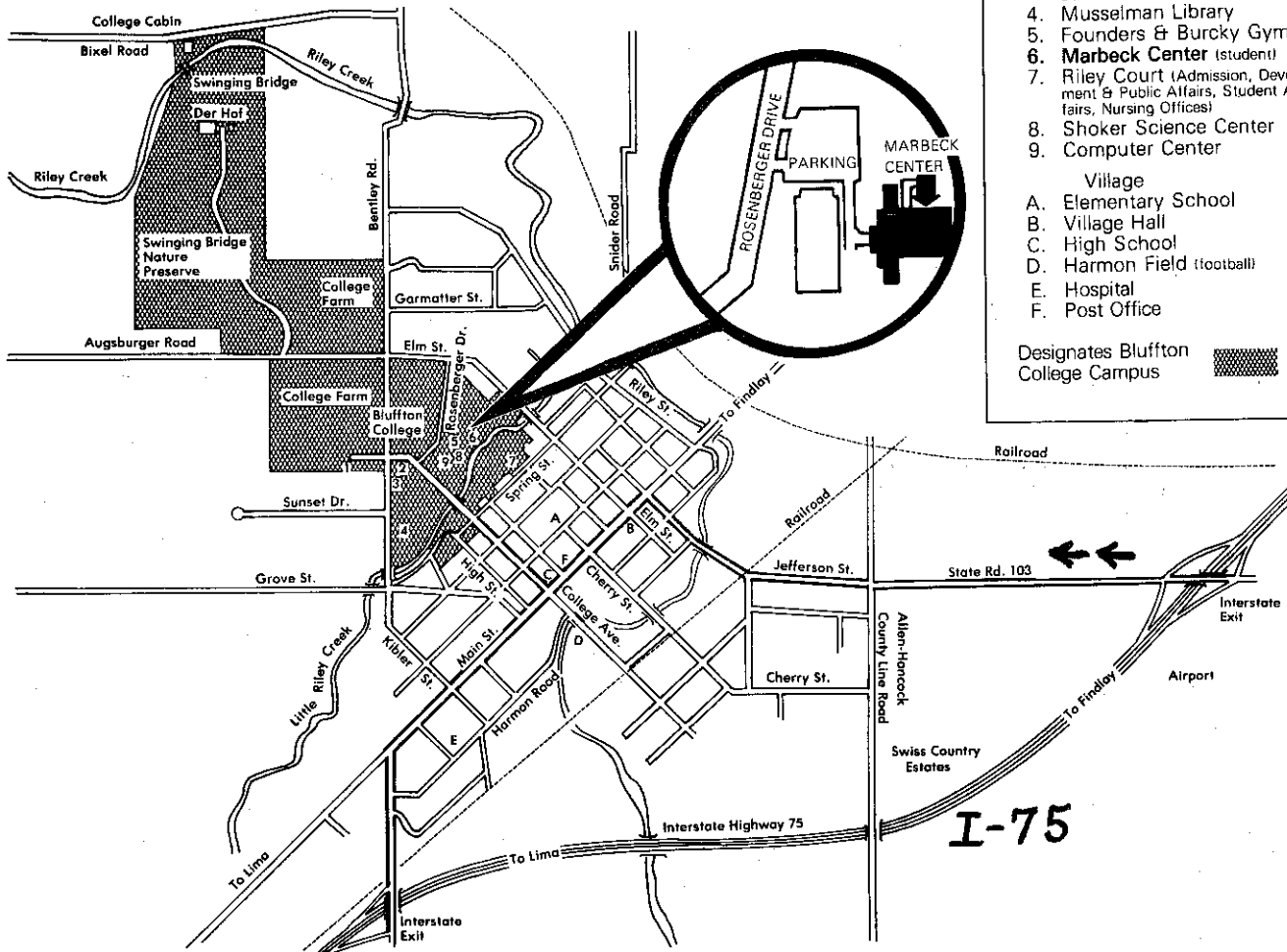

The Conference will be held at Marbeck Center on the Bluffton College Campus. The nearby parking lot is entered from Rosenberger Drive ( the parallel street east of Bentley Rd., between Elm St. and College Ave. (Note exploded view on map). Marbeck Center (no. 6 on the map) is just southeast of the parking lot and east of Founders and Burcky Gyms (no.5 on the map). The Mennonite Historical Library is on the 1st floor of the Musselman Library, on the east side of Bentley Rd., just south of College Avenue and north of Riley Creek (no. 4 on the map).

The well-known librarian, Delbert GRATZ, will be available there until 10 p.m..
